### "Understanding Friends Discernment," WYM Winter Retreat, February 14, 2009

The theme for this year's Western Yearly Meeting Winter Retreat is "Understanding Friends Discernment." This is a wonderful workshop for members who participate in Western Yearly Meeting decision making process, as well as those on the local meeting level. If you are currently a clerk, this is an excellent opportunity for training and the chance to have questions addressed about the purpose of meetings for worship with a concern for business. Our speaker for the day is Bruce Bishop, Northwest Yearly Meeting's Communication Director and Co-Author of the book, Practicing Discernment Together, Finding God's Way Forward in Decision Making (books are available through the Western Yearly Meeting Office for \$16). This year's cost is \$10 (which includes lunch if you register by February 1, 2009). If three people from a meeting attend, the pastor comes FREE. A children and youth program is provided free of charge to everyone who registers by February 1!
