News of Western Yearly Meeting of the Friends Church

Superintendent's Bible Study, I Corinthians 12:1-13

Paul uses the image of the body to describe the church—there are many members but one body. He actually repeats this phrase three times in this chapter (vs. 14, 20, 27). People in the church play different roles in the same way there are different parts of the body: hand (vs. 15), ear (vs. 16), and eye (vs. 17). Each performs different functions to help make the body as a whole operate. We are reminded there are a variety of gifts used in the church for ministry. The word, "variety," describes the giftedness in the church where a diversity of gifts works together.

Another key word being used here is "one." "For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body." Unity comes through the baptism of the Holy Spirit (verse 13). To be spiritually baptized is to be regenerated by the Holy Spirit (John 3:3,5). Our unity comes from the common experience we share in the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

"Salvation is deliverance from sin and possession of spiritual life. This comes through a personal faith in Jesus Christ as Savior, who, through his love and sacrifice, draws us to Him. Conviction for sin is awakened by the operation of the Holy Spirit causing the soul to feel its need of reconciliation with God. When Christ is seen as the only hope of salvation and a [person] yields to Him, he [or she] is brought into newness of life, and realizes he [or she] has indeed become a child of God. This transformation is wrought without the necessary agency of any human priest, or ordinance, or ceremony whatsoever. A changed nature and life bear witness to this new relation to Him. The whole spiritual life grows out of the soul's relation to God and its co-operation with Him, not from any outward or traditional observances. Christ Himself baptizes the surrendered soul with the Holy Spirit, enduing it with power, bestowing gifts for service." (Faith and Practice of Western Yearly Meeting of Friends Church, 2005, p. 7)

Diversity in the church is in its giftedness, not in theology. Unity in the church comes in the common experience we share in the baptism of the Holy Spirit which comes from Jesus Christ.
