"And this I pray that your love may abound still more and more..." (Philippians 1:9a, NAS)

The prayers of the New Testament Philippian church resulted in a witness of abounding love. Through joyful praise, abundant thanksgiving, sincere confession, reconciling forgiveness and fervent petition, we open our hearts to the work of Christ. The Holy Spirit pours forth God's overflowing "agape" love into the heart of the believer (Romans 5:5). This "agape" love is an "abounding" divine love (*Gk. word "perisseia" means "in excess, overflowing, over and above"*). As we personally experience God's "agape" love, it overflows to those around us. The abounding love experienced by the Philippians led Lydia to offer hospitality to Paul and Silas, the jailer to wash the wounds of Paul and Silas after they were flogged for the deliverance of a slave girl, and the Philippian church to generously support Paul in ministry (Acts 16 and Philippians 4:15-20).

Christmas is a time we celebrate God's abounding "agape" love for us and the birth of Jesus Christ. Mary, the mother of baby Jesus, found her soul filled with joy (Luke 1:46-56). The poor shepherds praised God when they witnessed a heavenly choir and Christ the Savior lying in a manger (Luke 2:8-20). The foreign wise men followed the star light to worship the Messiah born in Bethlehem (Matthew 2:1-12). Those not considered traditional religious leaders were chosen to experience God's abounding love. Advent is the reminder to prepare our hearts anew for the Christ child and God's abounding love.

Missions Update

SEEDS: Seeds Educating Every Deserving Student

The vision for the SEEDS project was conceived in discussions with John Muhanji and American Friends visitors to Kenya in 2009-2010. The visitors observed there were many educational needs within the Friends schools and were concerned about specific ways to assist with these needs to improve the quality of the Friends schools for the children they serve. As the brainstorming session progressed, it became evident that even a small agriculture endeavor could provide some financial stability to support peace education initiatives and other worthy educational efforts. Currently in Kenya, the growing of large acreages of corn (maize) is a stable and viable method of producing additional sources of income.

The vision for this project is based on the success of such an agricultural effort. Initially we propose to lease at least 100 acres of farm land for growing of seed maize for at least ten years consecutively. Initially this would fund the writing and printing of primary and secondary peace education curriculum for the Friends school. The other project with highest priority would be ongoing funding for a Superintendent of Education position, a staff who would be housed in the Kisumu Kenyan Office.

There is a need to raise \$60,000 for this project. If you are interested, please send your contributions to the Western Yearly Meeting Office designated for SEEDS!

Adopt-A-Nurse

The Western Yearly Meeting 2010 Special Outreach Project is "Adopt-a-Nurse" for the Kaimosi Hospital nurse salaries in Kenya. The goal is to raise \$10,000. There is a great need for qualified nurses and the only way to attract them and keep them is if they are paid regularly.

A special thank you goes to those who have contributed already this year to the special project, "Adopt-A-Nurse." As of November 30, 2010 we had raised \$7,739.21.
