### **Christian Education Update from Pat Byers**

The theme for our camps at Quaker Haven this year is "There's an App for that!" This is taken from the popular Iphone ads that tell us about all the possibilities of the uses of these smart phones. What caught us as we were planning camps is the fact that God places things inside each of us so that we can be the applications of His purposes in the world. We call these applications gifts. A verse that came to us on this theme is 1 Peter 4:10:

Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.

In this verse we are reminded that the gifts we have been given are about serving others, and that God's grace can be known in its 'various forms'. We are the carriers of God's grace as it is spoken in how we interact with each other. God has given us the opportunity to allow His Kingdom to burst forth in us as these gifts are used to His glory. So, this is what we are going to challenge our students at camp with this summer. First, what might be some of the gifts He has placed inside each of us? And next, how do those gifts give us reason and purpose to proclaim His Kingdom come, on earth as it is in heaven? This, after all, is what the Christian experience is all about!

Please pray for all of us who are involved in this summer's camping program that our message would be clear, and that the students would go back to their home meetings with a new found sense of hope and grace as they open up to the wonder and fullness of God's moving in their lives.
