Beatrice was very active as pastor's wife and in the USFW and USFWI. Herb and Beatrice were missionaries with Friends in Kenya for a while.

Jesus grew up and became the teacher of the will of God. Many followed him as disciples spreading the Good News.

On New Year's Day, 1923, Teacher Mildred White from Indiana left Ramallah Friends Schools on a 10 mile ride to Jerusalem to catch the northbound train. She was on her way to language school at Suk-El-Garh in Syria to study Arabic. Various countries in the area lived in harmony.

Now many years later coming after many years of violence among the mostly unchristian people of various denominations, religions, or no religion we see hope as the meetings for <u>NEGOTIATIONS</u> overcome violence.




